## What are Core Classes?

Mission matters to us at Leroy Community Chapel. God's mission that is! Just what is God's mission? To make His name glorious as He declares His fame to the ends of the earth (Isaiah 43:7; 48:11; 66:18-19). How does He do that? He demonstrates what a great God He is through His plan to save sinners based only on the work of His Son, Jesus! Simply put, God's mission is His glory. His glory is seen most radiantly in His work of redemption. That's where His mission touches us. Leroy Chapel is a group of people who have been redeemed and want others to find salvation in Jesus also.

So, our mission is "to completely transform our families, community, and world into devoted followers of Jesus Christ through the Word of God." We exist to further the work of God in the world, and we do that through joyfully embracing the Gospel and living in the grace God supplies. Our mission isn't clever, slick, or changing with each new year ... our mission is to do what Jesus told all His followers to do – "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations ..." (Matthew 28:19-20). That means that your mission as a part of Leroy Community Chapel is to walk with God and help others do the same. Every member has this mission, and our Core Classes are aimed at helping everyone understand *His* mission, *Our* mission, and *Your* mission.

In Matthew 22:37-40, Jesus gave the greatest commandment – "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind ... and love your neighbor as yourself." If you learn anything else at Leroy Chapel, we pray you learn to love God. So how, you ask, do I do that? It starts with loving His story, the story of His glory – the Gospel, and this is the foundation for our *Core Class I*, the **Gospel Class**. In this class we will lay the Biblical foundation for Gospel and work out the practical ramifications for your life and how we do church ministry. Next, loving God involves learning about and loving the character of God. We do this through a life-long journey of Bible study. The Word of God contains all we need to know about who He is, and what He has done. This forms *Core Class II*, our **Doctrine Class**. Finally, as you grow in your understanding of, and love for, Gospel-saturated living; and learn to walk in the God-revealed truths of the Scriptures; you will delight in the plan God has for your life. This plan is for you to be a devoted follower of Jesus, using your gifts to bless others, and pouring your life into the Kingdom mission of God here on earth. This is our *Core Class III*, the **Mission Class**. The church exists because of the never-ending cycle of God's mission entrusted to faithful followers who entrust it to other faithful followers, who never stop loving God and loving others enough to make sure they don't miss out on the grace of God in the Gospel.

This great cycle is called Discipleship, or as we like to say around Leroy Chapel – transformation. And we want you to know that there is no greater joy than this Gospel life. There is no greater truth than Bible truths. And there is no greater purpose than giving yourself to the cause of Christ in the world. We pray these *Core Classes* are used by God as an instrument of transformation in your life, and that you in turn will be used as an instrument of transformation in the lives of others ... many others! Thanks for joining us in this mission.

## Why do we love the Mission?

### *5 – Because we trust in our Triumphant God*

“After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands, and crying out with a loud voice, “Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!””

(Revelation 7:9-10 ESV)

### *2 – Because we believe in a Missionary God*

“And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.”

(John 1:14 ESV)

### *3 – Because we’ve heard the call of God*

“As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you.””

(John 20:21 ESV)

“And Jesus came and said to them, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.””

### *4 - Because God’s heart is that all people would be saved*

### *5 – Because we sense the urgency and compassion for the lost*

“There was a rich man who was clothed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. And at his gate was laid a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who desired to be fed with what fell from the rich man’s table. Moreover, even the dogs came and licked his

sores. The poor man died and was carried by the angels to Abraham's side. The rich man also died and was buried, and in Hades, being in torment, he lifted up his eyes and saw Abraham far off and Lazarus at his side. And he called out, 'Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus to dip the end of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am in anguish in this flame.' But Abraham said, 'Child, remember that you in your lifetime received your good things, and Lazarus in like manner bad things; but now he is comforted here, and you are in anguish. And besides all this, between us and you a great chasm has been fixed, in order that those who would pass from here to you may not be able, and none may cross from there to us.' And he said, 'Then I beg you, father, to send him to my father's house—for I have five brothers—so that he may warn them, lest they also come into this place of torment.' But Abraham said, 'They have Moses and the Prophets; let them hear them.' And he said, 'No, father Abraham, but if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent.' He said to him, 'If they do not hear Moses and the Prophets, neither will they be convinced if someone should rise from the dead.'"

## Why the Gospel is central in Mission?

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God."

(2Corinthians 5:17-20 ESV)

### *1 – Because God has transformed our lives through the Gospel.*

- There is nothing as important as the day our lives were interrupted by the Gospel. As with Paul on

---

the road to Damascus, we have been confronted with the reality of who Jesus is and that has changed everything! Our sin has been swallowed up by the grace of God through the finished work of Jesus. All of the circumstances that surround our salvation differ from person to person, but the fact that we were sinners in need of saving is universal. But God, being rich in mercy, has reconciled us to himself through the Jesus. And now we are considered a new creature. No longer spiritually dead, but alive in Christ. No longer bound to our sin nature, but given the Holy Spirit that we might walk in freedom from the condemnation of our sin. What a joy!

***2 - Because the Gospel has given us a new identity as ambassadors.***

- As a new creation in Christ, we are citizens of a new land; citizens of heaven, on mission in this world as ambassadors of our heavenly King. We bear his name as Christians and we carry his message, the Gospel.

***3 - Because the Gospel is God's message of transformation for the world.***

- Our message is no different than the one that was given to the Apostles, recorded in the pages of scripture, preached and died for by Christians through the ages and eventually handed down by a faithful soul to you. And it is now our burden to carry the mantle of the message of the Gospel to our generation and the next.

## **Mission is...**

### **...gospel centered**

- The gospel is the message of the mission. When we have fallen in love with the Gospel story as the treasure worth selling everything we have to purchase, our mission then becomes a ministry of delighting in Christ in front of a watching world. We commend the Gospel to others from a heart that loves it more than anything. We are not salesmen peddling a cheap message; we are lovers of God and His message of hope for a lost world; the Gospel of Jesus Christ!

### **...a lifestyle**

- Mission is normal Christian living. As ambassadors for Christ, there is never a time when we are not on mission. That's not meant to be a guilt trip or look

---

over your shoulder to see who's watching statement. It's just a matter of good Theology. We are not our own, we were bought with a price. We are no longer slaves to sin, but slaves to Christ.

"You are not your own, for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body." (1Corinthians 6:20 ESV)

"I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship."  
(Romans 12:1 ESV)

- Yes, there will be times when we will do things and go places as a church in a more formal way to communicate the love of God. But most often, mission is experienced in the 95% of life away from program. It's more informal with neighbors, co-workers and classmates or a person you meet at the store. Hospitality, service and Christ like character are the greatest calling cards of all in this dark day.

### *...outward focused.*

- For many, mission has become more about "come and see" instead of "go and tell." Yes, our church be attractive, warm and welcoming of all who would step through the foyer. Hopefully the Spirit of God moves an unsaved person to begin to wonder about this peculiar people singing God's praise and speaking boldly about the love of God. But if this is the extent of the mission, then what comes of the other 95% of my life?

"Go therefore and make disciples" (Matthew 28:19 ESV)

- The church primarily is intended to equip the saints for the mission that we might have confidence in sharing the love of God outside the church.

### *...to the whole person.*

- God created whole people, not walking spirits or mindless physical bodies; therefore our ministry must be to the whole person. What does that mean? That means that we care about the things God cares about in the world.

“Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world.”  
(James 1:27 ESV)

- The conservative church for too long has focused on the back-end of that verse (keep oneself unstained from the world) to the neglect of the front-end of the verse. The Gospel cares about those who can't care for themselves, not just trying to “get people saved.”
- Where people are hurting, the Gospel has something to say. Where disease is winning, the Gospel provides a fight. Where relationships are disintegrating, the Gospel invades with healing balm.

“But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves.”  
(James 1:22 ESV)

***...local and global.***

- There is much work to be done on all fronts of the mission. This is why the mission of LCC includes families, communities and the world. There are people everywhere who need to hear the gospel. But it is not an either or kind of thing. You don't have to pick which one you are going to focus on. We are all involved in all three. Your family...obvious. But, your community? Yes the neighborhood you live in. The place where you shop. The gas station you go to. The lady who cuts your hair. Your kids school. The soccer games. The garbage man, the mailman, your co-workers, fellow students. You see it? It's where you live, work and play.

“But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.””  
(Acts 1:8 ESV)

- The most invisible part of the mission is just as important. There are places in the world where

there is no gospel witness at all; no missionary or Bible to communicate the gospel in their language. We must play a role in reaching these people with the gospel. With much prayer we believe God will guide us to the right partnerships so that we, the church, can play a part in the Great Commission.

**...confident in God.**

- Trusting God to accomplish *His* purposes through *His* story in *His* Word, we can freely move into people's lives in authentic ways. We don't need "cute" evangelistic techniques; we have to use a "canned" presentation; we simply need a motivation to see God's glory displayed through our love for other human beings. We approach others not to critique, judge, or coerce because we know from what we've been rescued and of the One who rescued us. For as different as people might be, our common ground is the reality of human suffering brought on through sin. Any attempt to belittle others pain, judge their sinful choices, or place ourselves over them is to miss the heart of what God has accomplished in our own lives.

## **Hinderances to having a heart for mission**

### ***Non-gospel Living***

- Making the best use of the time does not involve busyness and burnout, it involves resting in the Gospel and living purposefully. We go drastically wrong here to preach a message of "Go Do It" without remembering everything we've said up to this point in the class. The Gospel is not about our best efforts, but Jesus' finished work. The Gospel is not about our clever achievements, but Christ's one achievement. So, we rest in the Gospel, enjoying the beauty of the day, our families, His good gifts ... and we know that the Church is the only hope for the world.

"Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil." (Ephesians 5:15-16 ESV)

### ***Walking above or around people***

- We humbly participate in our community. We walk in our community, not above it or around it. We participate with Christian and non-Christian organizations that elevate the heart of God for the world; they care about the things that God cares about. As we interact with non-Christian people and organizations our commitment to God and His gospel remains unwavering.

“For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned.” (Romans 12:3 ESV)

### ***Professionalism***

- It always makes me shrink a bit when the phone call comes... “Pastor, my father is sick, he is going to die soon, will you come and share the Gospel with him?” Of course the answer is always yes, but it does beg the question. Why do we wait for the pastor? Why do we look to the missionary? Why do we wait for the evangelist to come to town to develop a relationship with our co-worker to the point where we can bring him to hear the guy who really knows how to “win em.” OK, enough of the rant...J Seriously, let’s resolve not to place people on pedestals that are unbiblical. Yes God has gifted some for unique work in the kingdom, but to those who believe he gave the right to become sons of God. We are children of the Most High! Don’t be afraid to love the people God has placed in your life.

“And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ,” (Ephesians 4:11-12 ESV)

### ***“The Event”***

- “I can’t wait to get to \_\_\_\_\_ so that I can invite \_\_\_\_\_ so that they can get saved.” If I’ve heard it once I’ve heard it a thousand times. God save us from this mindset that there is something special about the big event. It’s not that

---

the event is evil. We have planned and pulled off some pretty big events at LCC to the glory of God. We have flopped a few too. And there were some I wish we never attempted. But here is the regret of the big event. It does not represent normal Christian life. Nobody walks around the office with lighting equipment a band and a killer sound system hanging over their head. Don't depend on the big event as mission because they only come around a few times a year. Remember, mission is a lifestyle.

## 2<sup>nd</sup> Hour

### **World Mission – Taking the Love of God to the Nations.**

*Current World Mission Staff* (See Booklet: LCC World Mission Staff Booklet)

- So many companies, agencies and organizations have so many things they are trying to do well. The church is no different. There can be so many good things that creep in and cause a haze to grow over and around the most important things. But at LCC, we are working hard to keep our vision clear. It is a great vision, not because we are creative or crafty, but our vision is God's vision. LCC's purpose is to completely transform our family, community and **world** into devoted followers of Christ through the Word of God.
- Our World Mission Staff may not be in our services every week, but they, like us, have been confronted and showered with the grace of God in the gospel of Jesus Christ. And now, they study and teach others the same Word of God that has transformed their lives and ours. They teach the same gospel. They worship and desire to bring Glory to the same God. In this way, they are just like us; real people, changed by the gospel. The difference...they have heard a specific call to be sent out to be "on mission" somewhere else. Some are far off and some are in the States, but all have heard

the call, like you and me, to the Great Commission.  
To this we say, thank you Lord!

### ***Stewardship***

- One obvious tell of the heart of a church is to take a look at their budget. LCC gives generously to support our mission staff each month. We do not have a set percentage that we must spend on missions nor do we have a quota to fill of how many missionaries are on the team. As the Spirit of God has led, LCC has made adjustments through the years, sometimes bringing an increase or decrease in support. Our objective is to continually be assessing our mission objectives and maximize the use of the Lords resources to accomplish those objectives.
- When you give to LCC, you are giving to World Mission When an offering is taken on Sunday, all of the money goes to our general fund, which is disbursed according to a budget that is annually reviewed.

### ***Some Vision for World Mission***

***1 - Taking the Gospel to Unreached People Groups*** (See Article: The Amazing Countdown Facts)

#### ***2 - Partner with National Churches and Pastors***

- We believe that the Kingdom of God is to function like a body. When we know that a family member is in need, don't we usually go and meet that need? What about when the family member in need lives a long way off. We typically will utilize the closest family member that is able to meet the need. Well there are people in need al over the world. In need of and hearing the gospel. And it just makes sense for us to think creatively to partner with "family" all around the world to meet the needs of some of these people. We are not only a local Body, but a worldwide Body.
- National Churches and Pastors can be resourced and become partners to reach their "Jerusalem." There are unreached people groups that are far closer to the church in Ethiopia than Leroy Ohio. This model stands apposed to the traditional model of training an American and spending thousands and thousands of dollars to support a white family

in Ethiopia. This does not mean that we never go to Ethiopia, but it does mean that we uphold our high value for the church as a primary vehicle for worldwide evangelism.

### **3 – Focus on the People of Africa**

- In recent years we have had a growing interest in the needs in Africa. We have supported one family for 5 years in Swaziland. We have relationship with a man in Liberia who is a missionary with CEF. I have personally spent a month in South Africa and Swaziland. We have sent a mission team of students to Senegal for a project with NTM. And most recently, Our Lead pastor has joined our staff and brings with him a burden for Africa, having gone several times with church teams and even adopting 2 boys from Liberia. These things add up to a collective, “we hear you calling us, Lord.” Therefore in the coming months and years LCC will have a growing interest in partnering with the church in Africa to meet some of needs of the burdens of this country and most importantly, bring the gospel to the unreached people of Africa.

## **Short Term Mission -**

### ***Purposeful Exposure***

- Short Term Mission Trips are a means to expose the people of LCC to a taste of full time mission. The list of benefits of this ministry are so numerous, it would be hard to list them all. One of the greatest benefits of short term missions is that just about anybody can find that the talents and passions that God has placed within them are very useful for the Kingdom. But we believe the key to effective ministry here is purposeful. We don't want to spend money on doing things just for the sake of saying we did it. We want to expose people while training and furthering the work of the greater mission that LCC has been called to, both locally and around the world.

### ***Some Vision for Short Term Mission***

#### ***1 - Develop a heart for Mission***

- Young and old alike need to develop a love for mission. They need to learn a respect for culture and grow in there understanding of communicating the gospel in that culture. We will offer

---

regular opportunities for people to develop a heart for mission through sort term trips. Though there are many good opportunities for people to go on short-term trips, LCC would like to have the first opportunity to give direction to the LCC body regarding vision for mission.

## ***2 - Kingdom Partnerships***

- Part of purposeful Short Term Mission will include partnerships. We will pick those kinds of trips that will both expose people to sharing the gospel in word and deed in another culture and help further the focused mission of LCC through partnership with other churches and church leaders. That might be partnering with one of our existing World Mission Staff and their local church to help with the furthering of the gospel in their community. It could be a concentrated effort partnering with the churches in Northeast Ohio for an outreach. Or it could be taking any number of skills to Africa to partner with the church to help in the furthering of the gospel in an unreached area.

## **Community Ministry – Taking the love of God out of the church; where we live, work and play.**

### ***Neighbors First***

- Why not? It's where you live. This is why missionaries move all the way around the world – to live near people that need to hear the gospel. They spend time, eat with and play with the people they live with with the intention of sharing the love of God with them. Why shouldn't that work for us? Fact is, it does. We have been divinely appointed to be the hands and feet of Jesus to our neighborhood.
- HOW? Play days...block parties...holiday cookouts...movie nights...helping with a project...cutting grass...raking leaves...WITH YOUR NEIGHBORS... that's mission! It never ceases to amaze me that we will take 12 students all the way to Mexico for a sum of \$8,000 to do a VBS, but we rarely go across the street with a tray of cookies. Nuf of the rant...Neighbors first! J

### ***Workplace Mission***

- Through working hard, obedience to leadership, ethical practices and generosity a person can establish a great reputation in the workplace. This is not only for a raise. It is for the Kingdom. Your platform at work is a Kingdom platform. The hours you put into your job should not be wasted on selfish desires. You have been provided a job by God for his purposes. Yes, work hard! Yes, you should be the best employee that your company has ever known! Yes you ought to be compensated for it. But whether you are or not will never change the fact that your real boss is Jesus and your calling as an ambassador for Christ extends to the workplace.
- HOW? Offer to pray for your workmates. Eat lunch with them, not on your own. Invite them to your home away from the office to build relationships. Speak positively about church, finances, contentment, your family and your spouse. These things often lead to another conversation. Find other Christians in your workplace and build a strategy of reaching your workplace for Christ. Join or start a Christian businessman's association in your area to begin a network of Christians in the workplace. Mom's and dad's think it's cool when they hear about how their students are reaching the kids at their school, when they have the same opportunity at work. The workplace is a mission field!

### ***Play with Purpose***

- Play is not an opportunity to go "off mission." We are full time ambassadors for Christ. So even our joyfilled fun time with our families and friends can be intentional ministry.
- How? Take a friend and their family with your family when you play. When you're having a special meal, invite someone to come along. Visit with people on the sidelines at baseball, soccer or football practice and games. Thoroughly enjoy life right along with others who don't know the Lord...Be free to enjoy the Lord right out in front of everyone!

### ***UNO***

- Unity in Northeast Ohio is a Kingdom focused

---

movement of believers seeking a God-given, Jesus centered, Holy Spirit empowered unity through Prayer, Praise and Service.

- How can you be involved? Attend Praise events to be encouraged and encourage other believers around NE Ohio, Volunteer at Praise (Trust the Word), Volunteer at a Serve event (COH), join or start a prayer team with believers from other churches.

### ***Local Organizations***

- Northeast Ohio has many organizations that are serving some of the most needy in our community. They have heard a call from the Lord to minister in very specific ways. These are ministries that LCC supports and I would offer them to you as options for serving in our community. You can call any one of these ministries and get a tour and they would be happy to fill you in on opportunities for you to serve within their organization.
